Dear Child Care Professionals of Georgia:

I am writing to give you a preview of a change that will make DECAL's Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS) program more convenient for Child care providers. As you may know, CAPS administers the federal Child Care and Development Funds (CCDF) for the state. We issue scholarships to eligible low-income families for use with Quality Rated child care providers and reimburse the providers serving these children.



Until now our relationships with CAPS providers have been handled by a vendor. Beginning in the fourth quarter of this year, a dedicated team of DECAL employees will support CAPS providers directly. We at DECAL have longstanding relationships with Georgia child care providers, and we are making this change so that we can build on our existing relationships and improve services for providers. We organized our new provider relations team in consultation with some of our current CAPS providers.

The CAPS provider relations team will perform all the functions the vendor currently does, including enrollment of new providers, annual renewals, customer support, and provider training. We will also expand our outreach and training activities. We'll take a proactive approach to helping providers bill correctly; we'll offer more training and technical assistance; and we'll reach out to newly licensed providers to let them know about the advantages of participating in CAPS.

CAPS supports eligible families in reaching self-sufficiency, and CAPS providers play a crucial role in making high-quality care and education available to low-income families. CAPS providers can bill weekly for their services and receive payment by ACH transfer, usually within 10 days. CAPS providers also receive tiered reimbursement based on Quality Rated star levels. Tips & Tricks with the TACs

Classrooms known as **ECERS** (Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale) classrooms serving three-year-olds, should have the following items posted in the classroom at the eye level of the children:

- photos of the children in the class;
- colorful posters/charts/graphs;
- children's child-directed artwork;
- items showing your current theme;
- at least 2 math posters showing numbers with pictures of what the number means (ex. a poster with the number 3 with 3-pictures beside it of three things, such as 3- cow pictures, 3-flower pictures, 3-frog pictures)
- items showing diversity in race, culture, age, ability, and non-traditional gender roles. One example of diversity consists of a contrast. Examples: An Asian child and a child who is not Asian, an elderly person and a baby, a female firefighter and a male firefighter, a picture of children of two races, a person with a disability, and a person without a disability.

Talk with children about your classroom display during free play times and routine care. Use your display as a teaching tool:

- A handwashing poster displayed at the sink can be used to show a child the proper handwashing technique.
- The daily schedule can be used to show a child what happens next.
- A math poster can be used to count with a child playing in the block or math center.
- The weather chart can be used to discuss the current weather with a child before going outside.
- Discuss current interests or recent events with a child using photographs of the children.
- Discuss differences in people using diverse pictures.

As a home-based child care provider, you have a unique opportunity to contribute to the future success of the children in your care. The quality of care that you provide, the language that each child hears, the way in which you respond to a child's words and actions, and the attention that you give to each child influence children in many ways.

Your daily approach to child care affects:

- The quality of the relationships that the children in your care, both now and in the future.
- The way the children learn to talk and listen and the extent of each child's vocabulary.
- Their ability to reason and exercise self-control.
- Their motivation to learn and how they approach learning when entering school.

What is a PLC?

A PLC is a group of individuals who are collaboratively engaged in concept-driven learning by raising questions that are relevant to their context and working together to answer those questions. To better understand what a PLC is, it's often useful to start with what a PLC is not. A PLC is not a workshop. PLCs honor the expertise within the group and brings groups of people together to learn.

Secondly, a PLC is not a replacement name for a committee meeting, staff meeting, team meeting, etc. These types of meetings serve a purpose and have a place in the workplace, but they are not focused on learning as a primary goal.

What Does this mean for you?

Our Technical Assistance Coordinators offer PLCs as an additional way to provide Professional Development. In some cases, the PLC session can earn training credit for participants.
