If they do have a transfer records but graduated from high school in the calendar year preceding the enrollment fiscal year, e.g. Student graduated high school in 2015 and enrolled in Summer 15 or Fall 2015. OR do have valid transfer college records but all records occurred in the years prior to (and including) the high school graduation year, e.g., student graduated from high school in 2015 and all transfer records occurred in 2015 or prior years.
